

Course Placement

Appropriate course placement is an essential component of academic success. Standardized test scores often inform a student's course placement in math or writing, but they are not the only measure available. In the case of writing placement, students may complete a c (<https://www.uaa.alaska.edu/countdown/course-matching-survey>) (<https://www.uaa.alaska.edu/academics/office-of-academic-affairs/student-success/first-year-advising/first-year-101.cshml/>) and submit a writing sample (<https://www.uaa.alaska.edu/countdown/>) to receive specific guidance on their placement options and next steps. Students may also be eligible for placement based upon nontraditional credit (<https://catalog.uaa.alaska.edu/academicpoliciesprocesses/academicstandardsregulations/nontraditionalcreditpolicies/>). Students should consult their academic advisor (<https://www.uaa.alaska.edu/academics/advising/>) prior to registration to discuss placement scores and course prerequisites for appropriate course selection. Refer to this catalog for specific course prerequisites and placement score requirements.

Communication Course Placement

The following communication (COMM) courses require appropriate placement scores for course registration. A student who has earned an appropriate ACT, SAT, or Accuplacer score is eligible to enroll in the courses listed in the table below. The following table shows the minimum scores needed to place into specific courses.

Mathematics Course Placement

A student who has completed the course prerequisites is eligible to enroll in MATH or STAT courses. MATH or STAT prerequisite courses are valid for 24 months from the date completed.

A student who has not completed the course prerequisites must earn an appropriate score on a UAA-approved placement test. MATH placement test scores are valid for one year from the date taken.

Writing Course Placement

Writing (WRTG) and Preparatory English (PRPE) courses require appropriate placement scores for course registration. A student who has earned an appropriate ACT, SAT, or Accuplacer score is eligible to enroll in the courses listed in the table below.

Students with ACT or SAT scores that place them in 200-level WRTG courses may receive credit by placement for WRTG A111 upon completion of WRTG A211, WRTG A212, WRTG A213 or WRTG A214 with a grade of C or better. To receive this credit, students must submit the appropriate form to the Office of the Registrar.

Students placing into WRTG A080 or WRTG A090 should consult an academic advisor (<https://www.uaa.alaska.edu/academics/advising/>) to discuss course options and consider additional placement measures. Call (907) 786-0338 to request a writing placement appointment on the Anchorage campus or contact the testing center at your community campus.
